
Jack (R) made a cake for his great nan's birthday. He measured and mixed the ingredients

Isobel (R) has been ordering the letters of the alphabet using upper and lower case letters. Well done Isobel.




Drew (Y1) has been stretching her culinary muscles this week making her own spaghetti. How impressive!



Ellis (N) has been outside hunting for mini beasts and made this ladybird using a paper plate! What a great idea!




